**DFW'S NEW INTERNATIONAL TERMINAL NAMED
NUMBER ONE PROJECT IN TEXAS**

**TOP 25 PROJECTS IN TEXAS PROVE VITALITY OF
THE STATE'S CONSTRUCTION INDUSTRY**

DFW INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT, Texas (July 3, 2002) — DFW's new International Terminal was named the top project in June's issue of Texas Construction in a list of the 25 top projects in the state of Texas for 2002, according to the Texas Construction Article. Despite the attacks of September 11, construction projects are up in Texas and the industry remains stable.

Almost every area of construction is in this year's list from airports, convention centers, education, entertainment, healthcare, high rises, highway, hospitality, public building, power plants, renovation, retail, sports arenas and transportation projects. Some other projects in the top 25 include the following: the Cottonwood Power Project located in Newton County on the Louisiana border, the Wise County Power Plant just northwest of the Metroplex and the M.D. Anderson Cancer Ambulatory Clinical Building in Houston. Gaylord's Opryland Texas in Grapevine also made the list at number five.

DFW's International Terminal D is scheduled to open the first quarter of 2005 and will boast 28 swing gates capable of handling wide- or narrow-body aircraft. The new consolidated INS can handle 2,800 passengers per hour and 120 ticketing positions will be available for customer convenience. The two-million square-foot terminal will contain 100,000 square feet of concessions space and an integrated 300 room Grand Hyatt hotel complete with rooftop pool and spa. A new 8,100-space parking facility complete with smart technology will complete this new terminal.
