Singapore Airlines begins new cargo service from DFW Airport this fall

DALLAS/FORT WORTH AIRPORT, TEXAS (June 21, 2001)—Singapore Airlines will offer new twice a week cargo service from DFW Airport to Changi Airport in Singapore in mid-September. The carrier will transport high tech equipment such as integrated circuits, aircraft parts, telecommunication systems, computer parts and office machinery.

“We are very pleased to have Singapore Airlines service here at DFW Airport,” said Joe Lopano, executive vice president of marketing. “This new service is further validation that DFW has become the pre-eminent mid-continent cargo center to Asia.”

Singapore Airlines new cargo service is expected to generate an estimated \$6.7 million to the local economy. With Singapore’s new cargo service, DFW Airport has 19 international cargo flights per week, serving five countries, generating more than \$31 million annually to the North Texas region.

Some of the top revenue items generated from international cargo flights services and transports include fuel expenditures, landing fees, crew expenses, ground transportation, freight forwarding and warehouse services.

DFW International Airport is the world’s third busiest airport, serving 60 million passengers a year. Offering nearly 2,300 flights daily, DFW Airport provides nonstop service to 132 domestic and 32 international destinations worldwide.
